<b>E</b>	By the Hawksworth Road, leaving Baildon, just past the Eaves Car Park and at the brow of the hill, there is a white Trig Point. Nearby there is a biblical text. Which part of the bible is it from?	
<b>F</b>	The Hamlet of Baildon Green is a Conservation Area and has lots of interest as well as providing access to Baildon Bank and The Glen. It has its own pond near The Church on the Green, but how many Cherry Trees are there?
